the Library Board and the Operations Manager. It was well attended by the Community and was estimated to be between 125-150 guests that attended.


They offered great silent auction items, door prizes and raffle prizes. Nearly \$4000 in very generous contributions were donated for the event!

POLICE SWEAR IN OFFICER

utherlin Police Department is back up to full staff again! We've recently hired another officer bringing us up to full staff.

Cody Mann, formerly of the Douglas County Sheriff's Department joined us on April 16th when he was sworn in by City Recorder, Diane Harris, during a ceremony in front of family, peers and co-workers.

Cody was born in Oregon and lived in the area of Sutherlin until he was 11 months old. He then relocated to California where he grew up attending High School in Yuba City, CA. He graduated at the age of 17 and enlisted in the United States Army directly out of high school.

Cody spent a little over three years in the active duty Army as an infantryman stationed at Fort Carson in Colorado. He served one 8 month combat rotation in Afghanistan, primarily as a machine gunner.

He was honorably charged as an E-4 Specialist when left the Army in 2013. He returned to Oregon where he lived with his grandfather. Upon returning to Oregon he employed became with Orenco Systems here in Sutherlin and then eventually with the Douglas County Sheriff's Department in 2014 as a corrections deputy, before taking a road deputy position.

Cody applied for the

Sutherlin Police Department because he lives in the Sutherlin area, likes the community, and wanted to police the area he likes so much.

entral Avenue is moving right along with great results! Unfortunately, not fast enough for most of us. But it is getting better and what is done looks awesome! More of the decorative lights should be going up soon and you can look forward to Sutherlin Downtown Development putting up the hanging baskets which will be hung this year about the first part of June.

Approximately the last two weeks of July you can expect the grinding and inlay of Central Avenue to start taking place. The work is scheduled to take place late evening and night to try to avoid too many traffic problems. The grindings will be taken to Ford's Pond on the SE upper terrace, so don't be surprised if you hear trucks out in that area late evenings to unload. It is our intention and plan to have this completed before Blackberry Festival. Keep your fingers crossed!

Some of you may be aware the City Council approved the Valentine Avenue Project. Those that use that street often will be excited with that news! The project is moving forward and is now being surveyed

and then to design with the Design Engineers with anticipation of that being done by December of this year. Once that is completed the City will schedule a meeting with the residents who live on Valentine so they are up to speed on the entire project. The projected start date for actual construction to begin on Valentine Avenue is May of 2019. It is a long process but will be wonderful once completed!

As of the first of May the City has approved 56 building worksheets so far in 2018! The City is growing by leaps and bounds! The majority of those are taking place west of I-5.

For those living up off of Dovetail you can expect a new street light to be installed on the northeast corner at Dovetail and Hwy 138W. It may take a while yet, but it is coming!

On May 16th we will be having the Pre-Construction meeting for the Wastewater Treatment Plant. It's scheduled for 10am at the Community Center Meeting Room. 150 S. Willamette Street.

Again, we thank you all for your patience with all the construction that's going on!

PROPOSED BUDGET APPROVED

The Budget Committee approved the proposed budget for the Fiscal Year 2018-19 in the amount of \$39,396,879 on May 16th.

The Budget Committee is comprised of 14 people, seven of which are the Council members. The other seven consist of Sutherlin Citizens. All are volunteers who donate their time and efforts for the betterment of Sutherlin.

Once the Budget is approved by the Budget Commit-

tee it is then forwarded to the Council for adoption. That will be presented to the Council at the May 14th City Council meeting which begins at 7pm in the Civic Auditorium - 175 E. Everett Avenue. The public is always invited, welcome and encouraged to attend.
